The 2010 refresh of Devon's Local Area Agreement

Devon's Local Area Agreement (LAA) is subject to an annual review (often called a refresh) with GOSW. The review provides an opportunity to revise, by exception, particular targets to reflect changes in local circumstances or national priorities.

The refreshed LAA for Devon was submitted to the Secretary of State for Communities and Local Government on **18 March 2010** and was signed off by Jon Bright (on behalf of the Secretary of State for Communities and Local Government) on **13 April 2010**.

Local Government and Public Involvement in Health Act 2007 Approval of Local Area Agreement Revision Proposal

In exercise of the powers under section 112 of the Local Government and Public Involvement in Health Act 2007 ("the Act"), I approve the Local Area Agreement revision proposal submitted on 18th March 2010 by Devon County Council.

The Devon Local Area Agreement shall have effect subject to the changes set out in the revision proposal from 1st April 2010.

In exercise of the powers under section 109 of that Act, I designate those local improvement targets as indicated in the attached copy of the Devon Local Area Agreement.

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The Devon Local Area Agreement 2008-2011

What are Local Area Agreements?

- A **Local Area Agreement (LAA)** “Sets out the ‘deal’ between central government and local authorities and their partners to improve the quality of life for local people. As such, the LAA is also a shorter-term delivery mechanism for the **Sustainable Community Strategy**”¹

The Improvement and Development Agency (IDeA) proposes the following:

- LAAs are three-year agreements, developed by local councils with their partners
- LAAs allow for more collaborative action and service delivery by bringing together partners from the public, private and voluntary sectors.
- Through LAAs, different localities can channel public resources towards the priorities of their own areas, (alongside national outcomes and targets).
- Within each area, LAAs are overseen by Local Strategic Partnerships (Devon’s DSP). The local authority is the lead partner in the local strategic partnership and the statutory ‘responsible body’ for the LAA.
- Under the Local Government and Public Involvement in Health Act 2007, a significant list of ‘named partners’ now have a statutory ‘duty to cooperate’ in the achievement of LAA targets

Named Partners: Arts Council, The Broads Authority, Chief Officer of Police, District authorities, English Heritage, The Environment Agency, Fire and rescue authorities, Health and Safety Executive, The Highways Agency, Jobcentre Plus, Joint Waste Authorities, Joint Waste Disposal Authorities, The Learning and Skills Council in England, Metropolitan Passenger Transport Authorities, Museums, Libraries and Archives, Council, National Park Authorities, Natural England, NHS Foundation Trusts, NHS Health Trusts, Police authorities, Primary Care Trusts, Local Probation Boards; Probation, Trusts and other providers of probation services, Regional Development Agencies, Sport England, Transport for London, Youth Offending Teams, Any other organisations added by an order under section 104(7) of the Act or by primary legislation.

Devon's Local Area Agreement:

- Devon negotiated its current three-year LAA with the Government Office for the South West (GOSW), before it was agreed and signed off by the Secretary of State in **June 2008**.
- Devon's LAA contains 38 priorities all of which are grouped under the seven **Sustainable Community Strategy** themes.

Devon Sustainable Community Strategy Priorities:

- (i) A World Class Environment
- (ii) Strong and Inclusive Communities
- (iii) A Growing Economy
- (iv) Homes and Housing
- (v) Inspiring Young People
- (vi) Health and Wellbeing and
- (vii) A Safer Devon

Devon Sustainable Community Strategy cross-cutting themes:

- (i) Diversity and Equality
- (ii) Accessibility and Demographic Change.
- (iii) Climate Change, and our Impact on the Environment

- **The following criteria were used to guide the selection and development of the LAA priorities:**
 - LAA priorities will express the Sustainable Community Strategy vision, priorities and cross-cutting themes.
 - LAA priorities require multi-agency and partnership working.
 - LAA priorities will focus on prevention and tackling the causes of problems rather than symptoms.
 - LAA priorities will consider areas and groups in greatest need.
 - LAA priorities will be based on evidence.
 - LAA priorities will demonstrate creativity, innovation and ambition.
 - LAA priorities will deliver outcomes which are measurable over the three year period of the Agreement.

- Each of the LAA priorities is underpinned by a delivery plan that describes how the targets for improvement will be achieved. The delivery plans are available on the Devon Strategic Partnership website at: www.devonsp.org.uk/sustainablecommunitystrategy/outcomes/draftlaapriorities/index.html
